Minutes of Meeting held at The Royal; British Legion, Rodney Street, Edinburgh, EH7 4EL, at 1300hrs on Sunday 18th May 2014

- 2. **Chairmans Welcome**; Mick Walker welcomed all present and thanked them for attending
- 3. **Apologies ;** Willie Grant, Tom Ormiston, Rom McCartan, David Brock, Andy Mullen, Eoghann macLachlainn and all overseas members.
- 4. **Welfare Report**; Gil has been in touch with Raymond Mannion –apparently the medication he has been taking, both for his shoulder and prostrate gland, have been ineffective and he will require surgery in both areas.

No one in 131 received any Campaign Medals for their service in Al Milah and Al Anad and he asked the Prime Minister if a medal could be awarded, given 131 was the first TA Regiment to have been in action since WW2.

John has received an acknowledgment from Downing Street intimating his correspondence is under consideration.

John Donaldson and Gordon McLeod would like to know if anyone knows the whereabouts of Gus Paterson that he can be contacted regarding the 24 Sqn. RE., Al Milah reunion.

Frank Murray has spoken to Olaf Dudley who informs us that the current O.C 131 Indep. Cdo.Sqn . RE. is in favour of changing the name of the T.A. Centre to The John Lonergan Centre.
