**Minute of meeting held at the Royal British Legion, Central Branch, Rodney Street,  
Edinburgh at 1300hrs. on 15 May 2011**

## **1. MEMBERS PRESENT**

### **13. AIRBORNE FORCES DAY (SCOTLAND)**

### **DIRECTIONS**

From other directions turn off the M90 at the Halbeath Interchange and follow the signs for Dunfermline and the Kincardine Bridge. Go through the town on that road and after crossing The Glen Bridge The Glen Tavern is about 250yards on the right.

For anybody coming by bus, exit the bus station on the same road as the buses then turn left to The Glen Bridge and as above.
